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

He is a graduate of the Trinity Repertory Conservatory in Providence, RI and is a member of the Actors Equity Association. He has served as the Director of Musical Theatre programs at Drake University and the University of Missouri Kansas City's Conservatory of Music and most recently completed his tenure supporting emerging artists as Artistic Director of the Kalamazoo Civic Theatre. This marks Mr. Humrichouser's 29th Season at the Wagon Wheel Theatre.


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

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
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
